



Suzie Davis Quido, M.S., retired, was Supervisor of Secondary Mathematics for Pinellas County Schools as well as a middle school mathematics teacher, a high school mathematics teacher, and Secondary Mathematics Resource Teacher for forty years. She received the Kenneth Kidd Mathematics Educator of the Year Award from the Florida Council of Teacher's of Mathematics (FCTM) in 2000 and served as President of the Florida Association of Mathematics Supervisors (FAMS) from 12/01/01 – 11/30/03.

Ms. Quido was a coauthor on the Second Edition of *Transition Mathematics*. *Transition Mathematics*, a component of the University of Chicago School Mathematics Project, UCSMP, required students to read lessons to learn mathematics. She has completed post graduate work at the University of South Florida in Mathematics Education, with research interests on reading and writing in mathematics classrooms. As the secondary mathematics supervisor, she worked with the Florida Center for Interactive Media to produce the *Algebra Best Practices* CD that was used to provide professional development to teachers. Components of the CD included best practices in reading and writing strategies for mathematics teachers.

In addition to serving as the Math Consultant for the Pinellas County Schools National Literacy Project, she currently works as a freelance consultant for various companies correlating programs and assessment items to the *Next Generation Sunshine State Standards for Florida*. Ms. Quido also volunteers her time working with underachieving students in the *Bridging the Achievement Gap* program in Pinellas County.
